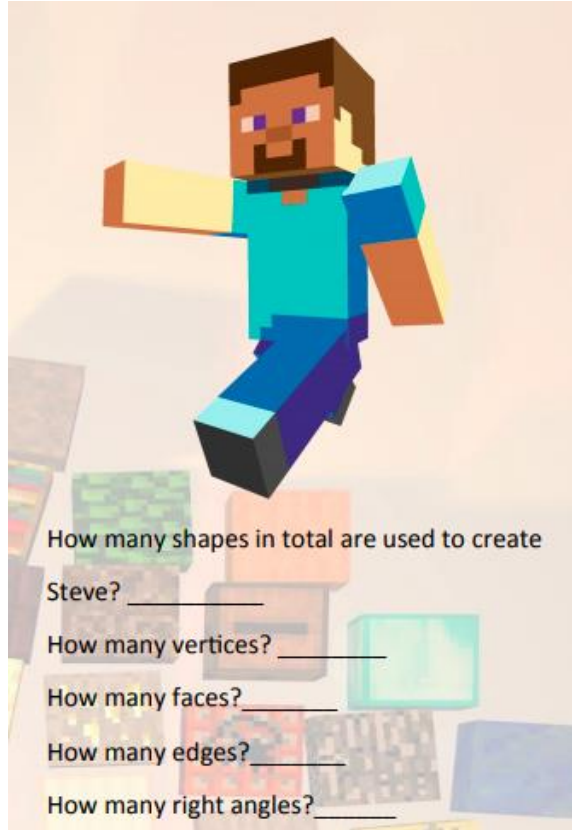


Maths Task
